

VERITAS PREPARATORY SCHOOL is an independent, Christian, classical, coeducational, non-discriminatory, University-Model School®, enrolling 313 students in grades k-12 located in the downtown area of Greenville, SC. The Veritas Telos is to be a community of students and families growing in the love of God as courageous learners, thoughtful communicators, and gracious servants. University Model Schooling provides an academically challenging education while integrating the home and the school in the common goal of educating children. Veritas is a classical school in terms of both pedagogy and curricula. Instruction in Latin begins in grade 3 and continues until the sophomore year of high school followed by Greek junior and senior year. Veritas began in the fall of 2013 and had its first graduating class in 2022.

# SERVICE LEARNING AND HOUSE SYSTEM

At Veritas, service learning is an integral part of our school community. The entire k-12 student body participates in 1 school day per semester of community service together as a school. Our Upper School students are encouraged to volunteer their time in creating school clubs and athletic groups for our younger students, growing in leadership with involvement in the House System, serving in student government, and organizing school social events . All students in grades k-12 are members of one of four houses.

# **CLASSICAL ACADEMIC DISTINCTIVES**

Veritas provides a rigorous, traditional liberal arts education, emphasizing reading of original texts and the study of classical language. Distinctives include: instruction in Latin and Greek; formal coursework in the liberal arts of grammar, logic, and rhetoric; Socratic seminars; and laboratory experimentation in all science courses. Students take the National Latin Exam annually in 6th-9th grades. Veritas uses the Singapore Dimensions Math Curriculum in K5 through 8th grades. Students translate Cicero in 9th grade. In 10th grade, students translate Virgil and Caesar, even if they are not enrolled in AP Latin. By the end of the 12th grade year, students are translating sections of the Greek New Testament and Septuagint.

Veritas does not disclose class rank for college admissions purposes. Veritas does not allow middle school courses to count towards high school credit.

#### **FINANCIAL AID**

For the 2023-2024 school year, 29% of students received financial aid; during the past 10 years over \$1 million in financial aid and tuition assistance has been awarded.

# ATHLETICS

Beginning in 5th grade, our Veritas students have the opportunity to compete in athletics. In only our third year of sports, we are competing in JV/Varsity Cross Country and Track, middle school and JV Girls Volleyball, middle school boys and girls basketball, and JV Boys Basketball. Our athletics program also provides positions for students to grow in leadership and serve their fellow students as team managers and team captain positions. All student athletes are committed to regular practices, competitions, and we are proud to be an NCAA-approved high school.

# SENIOR THESIS

In our capstone Senior Thesis course, students write a 20-25-page, six part, Ciceronian essay on a topic of their choice that must be substantial, controversial, and pertinent to the Christian life. This paper is presented in May to the entire school community and open to the public. Students must also answer questions from the audience at the end of their presentation.



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# **GRADING SYSTEM:**

Veritas utilizes a semester system with two 18 week semesters. A student's final numerical grade for the year is calculated by averaging the grades earned each semester and is the grade that will appear on the student's final official transcript. The VPS grading scale uses a numerical system ranging from 0-100, with corresponding 10-point letter-grade bands, to determine individual course grades. Each course is graded on the 100-point scale, with the grades from all courses averaged together at the end of each academic year to calculate the Cumulative Weighted Average (CWA). In recognition of the increased demands of Honors and Advanced Placement (AP) coursework, Honors courses are weighted with an additional 3 points, and AP courses are weighted with an additional 7 points. The weighted scores are only used in calculating the CWA and are not reflected in individual course grades. The Upper School utilizes the South Carolina Uniform Grading Policy (SCUGP) in calculating and reporting GPAs and grades. VPS will follow the South Carolina Uniform Grading Policy (SCUGP) for determining class rank. Rank will be calculated based on all academic classes at the end of each academic year, and rank will include all diploma seeking students enrolled at VPS.
